- In lieu of Australian Sports Commission recognition (and therefore support from ASADA), APU has engaged the services of a WADA-approved drug testing company currently used by the IPF.
- PWC Global Services GmbH have doping control officers worldwide, and recently domestically.
- Samples are analysed at a WADA-approved lab in Dresden, Germany.
- All associated costs are borne by APU via an invoice from IPF.
- Total number of competitors during period of testing was 533.
- 496 raw and 37 equipped athletes competed during period of testing.
- 13 anti-doping tests were conducted during period of testing:
  - 3 tests at SE QLD Summer Series DEC 2018 – Negative
  - 3 tests at APU QLD State 2019 – Negative
  - 7 tests at APU NSW State 2019 – Waiting Report from IPF Assistant Secretary of ADC

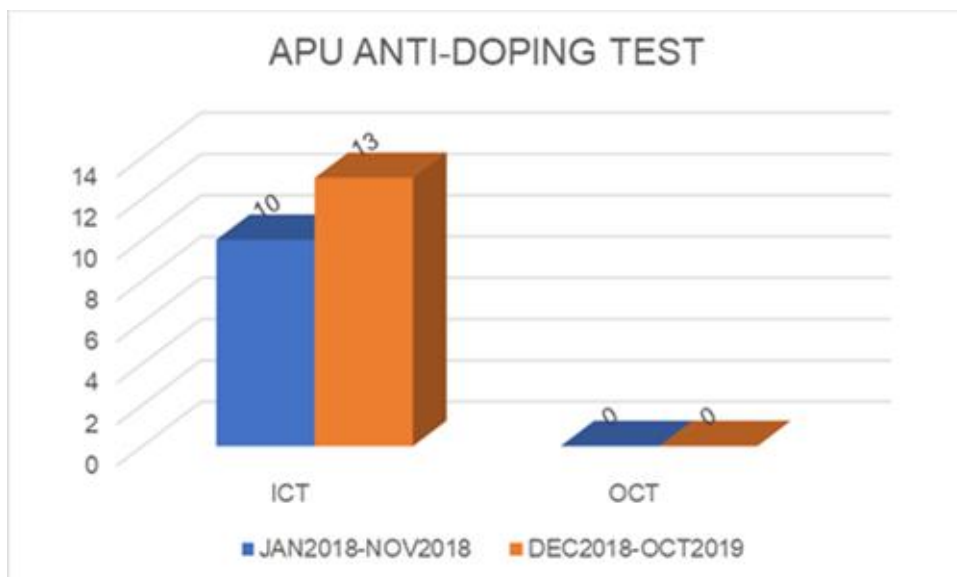
# Anti-Doping Report Cont'd

- 4 athletes applied for Therapeutic Use Exemptions:
  - 1 approved – managed by IPF
  - 3 current applications – managed by ASADA-APU
- Additional notes:  
Outcomes from the 2018 National Classic Championships (7 Tests) – Negative.

As per 25 September 2019, The APU Anti-Doping Policy has been approved by the Australian Sports Anti-Doping Authority (ASADA). This Anti-Doping Policy takes effect on 25 September 2019.
